For this Fiscal Year, we welcomed 360 new students into our program. We are now supporting more than 1,249 scholars.

b. Events and Trainings

National Scholars' Conference for Graduating Scholars

The National Scholars' Conference (NSC) is held annually for our graduating scholars. Through this, we aim to give them encouragement and equip them with practical knowledge they will need when they start applying for jobs and officially join the working world.

On April 23-24, 2022, thanks to the easing of quarantine restrictions nationwide, we are able to do it in a hybrid set up with 115 scholars in seven locations in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

• Real LIFE Talks

A Real LIFE Talk is an intimate 60-minute event where prospective partners can know more about who we are, our vision, and how they can support our work and our scholars.

We conduct Real LIFE Talks bi-monthly throughout the year. This has been very helpful in our efforts to raise funds.

Regional Graduation Banquets

We held regional graduation banquets for our scholars who earned their bachelor's degrees in the school years 2020-2021(Batch 10) and 2021-2022 (Batch 11). Because of the strict restrictions in the previous year, we were not able to commemorate the graduation of the former batch. With the ease of restrictions in 2022, we were able to combine the graduation of both batches and were able to do this face to face by gathering the scholars in Metro Manila, North Luzon, Central Luzon, South Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao. A total of 118 scholars graduated from our program.

c.) New Educational Partnerships

We signed a memorandum of agreement with the Department of Education Olongapo City and with a private school in Sta. Rosa, Laguna, St. Ignatius Academy. To date, we have a total of 18 private and public partner schools.

II. Difficulties/problems encountered and solutions

Since the launch of our Real LIFE Monitoring and Processing System (RL MAPS) back in July 22, 2021, we have been able to address the manual and tedious processing of our scholars' requests and documents. But with any new system and technology, we encountered challenges in the adjustment of our local center to processes as well as bugs in the system itself.

With the enormity of the project, we hired an IT personnel to cater to the concerns with the system.
