ABOUT REAL LIFE

Real LIFE Foundation, Inc. is a Christian nonprofit, nongovernmental organization that exists to honor God by serving and empowering the underprivileged youth of the Philippines through educational assistance, character formation, and leadership development.

We provide our scholars with financial assistance for tuition, miscellaneous fees, transportation and meals, and other school-related expenses. They are not only given monetary support, but are also plugged into LIFE groups where they are coached in the areas of Leadership, Integrity, Faith, and Excellence.



INTRODUCTION

Real LIFE began 2019 making plans to expand our scholarship program because we believed God was enabling us to help more underprivileged students. And indeed, He made it all possible.

As we worked toward strengthening our partnerships with schools and forming new connections, God opened doors for us on the campuses. We were able to officially seal partnerships with five private and semi-private schools. Beyond that, God made it possible for Real LIFE to be an official partner of the Department of Education.

By God's grace and with the faithful support of our partners, in 2019, we sent many more students to school and opened new centers nationwide.

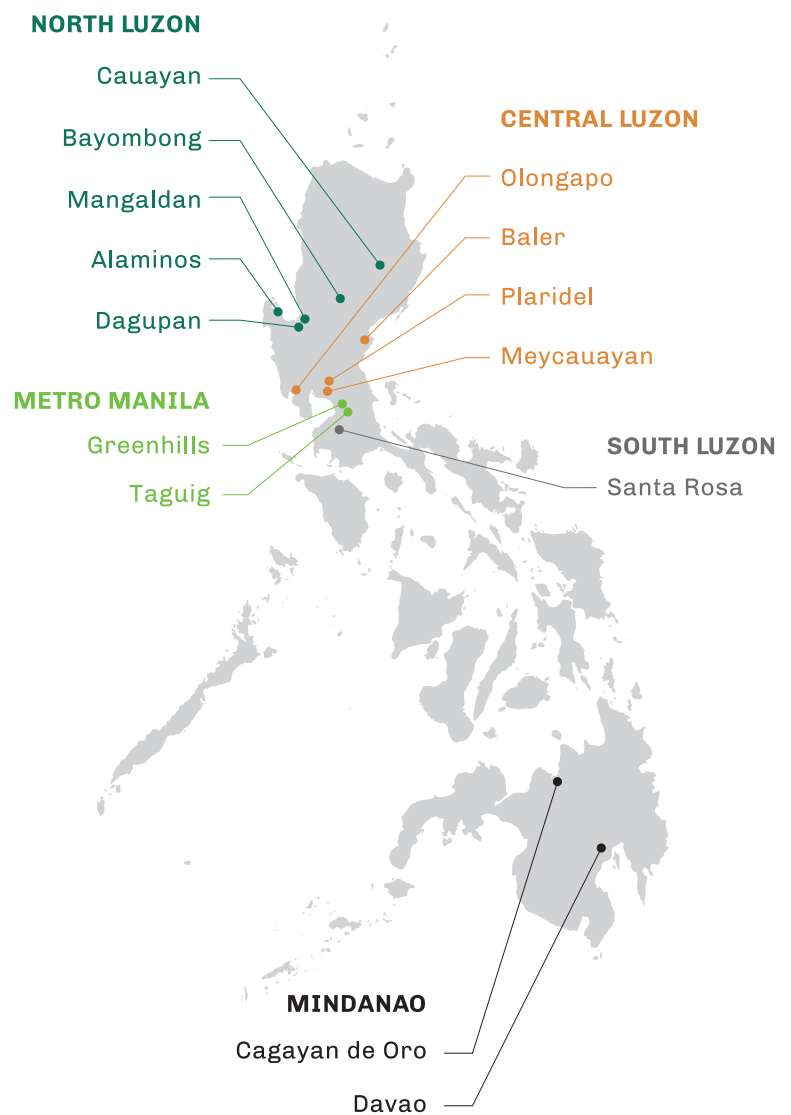


SECTION 01 KEY STATISTICS

01.A. We Opened 14 New Centers

As the need for educational assistance continues to grow, it is heartbreaking to turn down the applications of students from locations where there is no Real LIFE center. This is why we find it crucial to not only increase the number of scholars in our current locations, but also to be present in more cities and provinces.

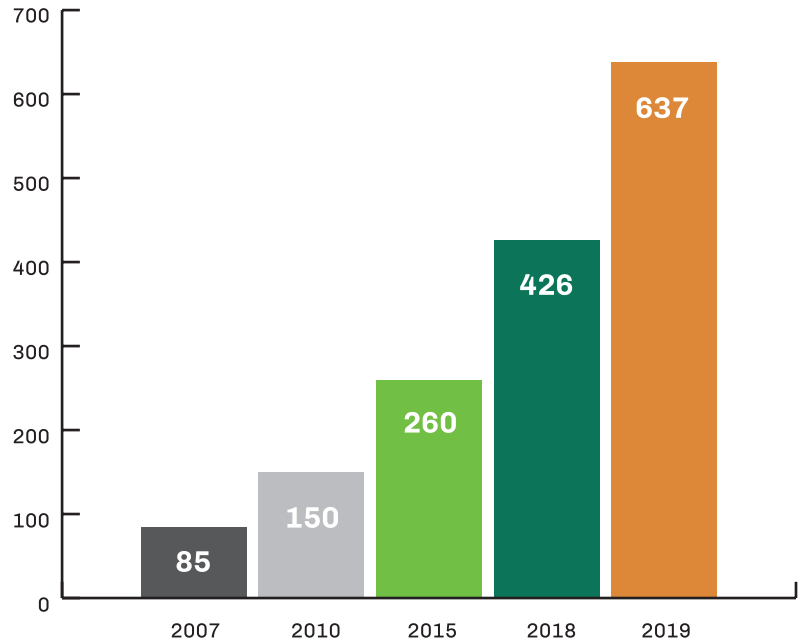
The opening of our 14 new centers in 2019 brought the total number of Real LIFE local centers to **54**.



01.B. We Supported About 50% More Scholars

Having more centers enabled us to support 637 scholars for S.Y. 2019–2020, about a 50 percent increase from S.Y. 2018–2019 when we had 426.

This is a significant increase in growth percentage since Real LIFE's incorporation in 2007, as reflected in the graph.



01.C. 69 of our Scholars Earned Their Bachelor's Degree

By the end of the year, we had 482 alumni in total; 91 of them are licensure exam passers.

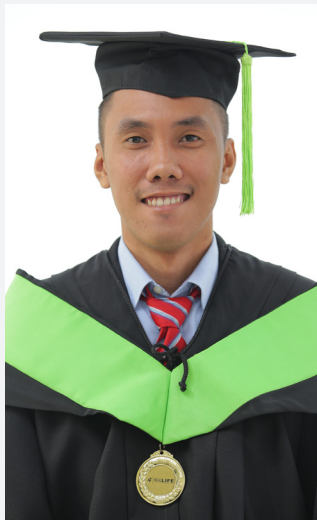
Joshua received a leadership award from his school and was also a recipient of the Province of Pangasinan Governor's Leadership Excellence Award.

EVENTS AND TRAININGS

02.A. NATIONAL SCHOLARS' CONFERENCE 2019

The National Scholars' Conference (NSC) is held annually for graduating scholars. As they will be graduating soon after the conference, it is one of our last opportunities to remind them of the values imparted to them throughout their time in the Real LIFE scholarship program.

The theme for NSC 2019 was Press On. Through different sessions and speakers, our scholars were encouraged to never stop fighting for their faith, their families, and their future.

NSC is also an avenue to equip our graduating scholars with practical knowledge that they will need when they start applying for jobs and officially join the working world. Sessions include resume writing, simulation of job interviews, and career planning.



02.B. ASIA YOUTH LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE BY THE CENTER FOR ASIA LEADERSHIP

The Center for Asia Leadership (CAL) brought their Teaching Fellows from Harvard University for the Asia Youth Leadership Conference on August 8, 2019, held for the first time in the Philippines especially for Real LIFE scholars, alumni, and coaches.

02.C. PARTNERS FOR CHANGE

Partners for Change was a banquet held on June 27, 2019, for school administrators and schools division offices. In this event, we presented an opportunity to explore partnerships and collaborations that would benefit a greater number of underprivileged students. The occasion was graced by Department of Education Undersecretary Tonisito Umali and was attended by hundreds of school officials representing 131 public schools and private universities in Metro Manila, Bulacan, Rizal, and Laguna.





SECTION 03

NEW PARTNERSHIPS AND AFFILIATIONS

03.A. ASSOCIATION OF FOUNDATIONS

On March 27, 2019, Real LIFE became an official member of the Association of Foundations (AF).

Established in November 1972, the Association of Foundations is the first network of nongovernmental organizations in the Philippines. Its mission is to enable its member foundations to develop sustainable programs for the communities they serve.

Through the years, AF has become a bridge to grant opportunities, a capacity builder, a data bank, a consultant, and an advocate of key issues. AF is also a venue where people and foundations with expertise in specific fields share their knowledge and experiences with smaller and newer organizations. It is committed to the constant growth and professionalism of its member foundations to improve the quality of human life.

03.B. ZERO EXTREME POVERTY PHILIPPINES

Real LIFE joined the Zero Extreme Poverty (ZEP) PH 2030 Coalition. With a vision of seeing Filipino families enjoy the fullness of life in sustainable communities, ZEP aims to uplift one million families from extreme poverty to self-sufficiency by 2030.

ZEP has member organizations from different sectors such as agriculture and fisheries, health, education, housing and shelter, livelihood, environment, partnerships for indigenous peoples, and social justice. Each one actively participates in achieving the global sustainable development goals set by the United Nations.

03.C. NEW PARTNER SCHOOLS

03.D. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

During our Partners for Change event for school officials, we sealed our partnership with the Department of Education, represented by the Undersecretary for Legislative Affairs, External Partnerships, and Project Management Service, Tonisito Umali.

This newfound partnership will enable us to bring the information about our scholarship program to more underprivileged students through direct coordination with the schools. Under the partnership, school officials may now endorse to Real LIFE their top academic students who need financial assistance the most.





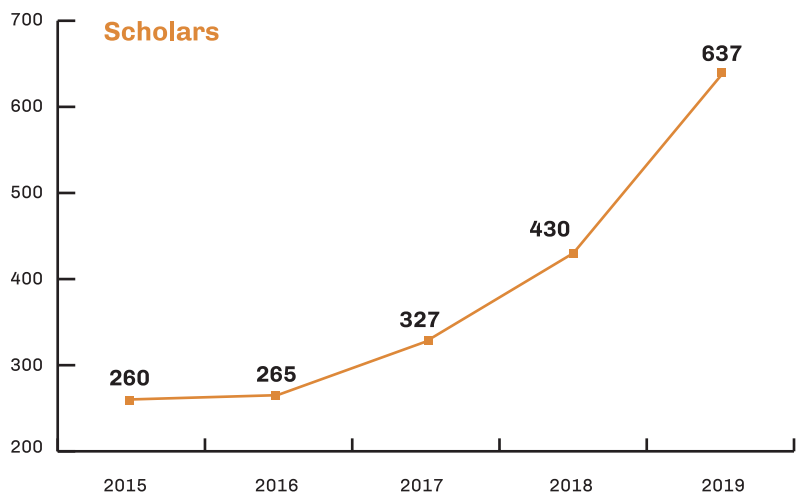
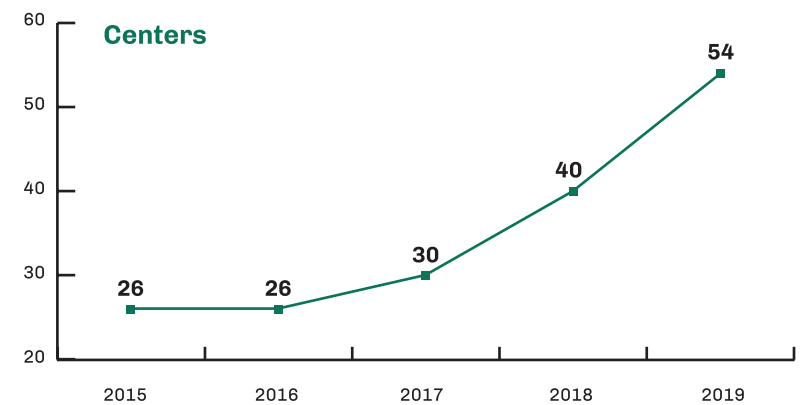
SECTION 04 IN 2020

We are so amazed at everything God has enabled us to do, and we dare to dream more for Real LIFE. This 2020, we have already opened 10 new centers in Antipolo, Bacoor, Bayambang, General Mariano Alvarez, Makati, Marawi, Nova Central, Quezon Avenue, San Carlos, and Silay.

From 637 scholars, we are targeting a 40 percent increase, which adds up to close to 900 scholars in the upcoming S.Y. 2020–2021.

This may be a huge jump from last year, but not nearly enough considering the great need. There are plenty more students and families who are hoping for a chance of getting a scholarship.

By God's grace, Real LIFE is now in a position for greater expansion to inspire hope in more homes. Thank you for journeying with us through 2019. We are excited for what God has in store for us in this new decade.
